



The University of Augsburg's "International Classroom Experience" programs are pilot projects for UniA exchange students who want to gain first-hand international education experience and broaden their intercultural skills. Interns have the opportunity to work with local pupils in a safe, supervised environment.

The University of Augsburg's International Office (IO) connects the students with local schools. Depending on the program and the schools' demands, interns have the opportunity to support local pupils in different areas or to enrich their school life with intercultural projects. Based on former confidence and experience these tasks are either supervised or instructed beforehand by a teacher. The interns are in close contact with the schools or teachers and the UniA IO is always a contact point.

Depending on the exchange student's home curriculum and requirements, these internships could be transferred to the home university (please ask your university advisor beforehand). After they have finished their program, interns receive a certificate from the IO and, if needed, a reference from the school they worked for.

Why should I join the program?

<b>A:</b> <u>End of School Year Projects</u> <b>during</b> UniA study enrolment, project work in June/July; flexible timing	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Send your expression of interest to IO UniA</li><li>• Receive the application form from the IO UniA</li><li>• Hand in application form to IO UniA after nomination</li></ul>
<b>B:</b> <u>Part-Time School Internship</u> <b>during</b> UniA study enrolment (f.e. once or twice a week); begin all year around	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• IO UniA matches students with local school job offers</li><li>• UniA establishes contact between schools and students</li></ul>
<b>C:</b> <u>Full-Time School Internship</u> <b>without</b> UniA study enrolment (ca. 13 lessons per week, f.e. foreign language assistant); begin all year around	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• IO UniA sends school announcements to home university</li><li>• Students apply directly to school</li></ul>
