MODULE AIMS:

The aim of the course is to develop students' methodological and language competencies necessary for physical education in English. Students will get a detailed picture of the aims of P. E., the management and the practice of teaching. They will explore how to promote young learners' language development effectively through leading physical activities. They will start to develop their own professional theories of teaching by reflecting on the observed activities.

MODULE SUBJECT:

In this course, the following topics are covered: 'creative movement', using rhymes, terms of P. E., giving instructions, using activities and games, structuring and planning a lesson, children's motor development. The course work involves presentations of theoretical and practical themes, microteaching, and reflecting on observations.
