## **COURSE DESCRIPTION**

Students will attain a broad perspective and knowledge of the shorter genres (children's poems, chants, songs and games) found in English-language children's literature while also practicing how to apply these works creatively for the purpose of fostering foreign language development in children ages 6-10. The course includes an overview of the terminology and significance of the subject. The genres found in children's literature as well as their characteristics will be discussed. Classical, folk and contemporary works in children's literature will be utilized in the holistic development of young children. Students will review the criteria for selecting works and gain the tools for utilizing various types of methodology.

## **COURSE CONTENT**

The course familiarizes students with English-language children's literature, including the necessary definitions, classifications, its role in aiding the complex development of children, the criteria for choosing a work, the methodology for analyzing works, listening to stories, reading stories aloud, writing stories, dramatization and techniques for creating a storybook.
