Field: primary, pre-school	Credit: 4 ECTS	Language: English
<p>Summary of the course: The course focuses on how people from different cultures communicate and understand each other. Students explore cultural differences (traditions, habits, values), reflect on their own cultural identity, and learn to recognize and challenge stereotypes and biases. Field: primary, pre-school	Credit: 4 ECTS	Language: English
<p>Summary of the course: The course introduces international students to the Hungarian education system, focusing on early childhood and primary education. It combines theory with practical insights into teaching methods, school types, and educational innovations. Field: primary, pre-school	Credit: 4 ECTS	Language: English
<p>Summary of the course: This course is designed for beginner international students who want to learn Hungarian. It teaches basic vocabulary, grammar, and everyday communication skills needed for daily life in Hungary. Field: primary, pre-school	Credit: 3 ECTS	Language: English
Summary of the course: The course prepares students to conduct and write academic research in English, especially in the field of education. It covers the basics of academic writing (structure, formal style, citations, avoiding plagiarism) and introduces key research skills such as planning a study, narrowing a topic, and using methods like interviews, questionnaires, and observation. Field: primary, pre-school	Credit: 4 ECTS	Language: English
Summary of the course: This course explores how English-language children's songs, rhymes, and games can support language learning in young children (ages 3–10). Students learn about different types of games (e.g. action songs, circle games, drama and word games), their cultural background, and their role in child development. The course also emphasizes practical skills—students practise leading games, creating their own activities, and integrating playful methods into teaching. Field: primary, pre-school	Credit: 4 ECTS	Language: English
Summary of the course: This course introduces basic geometric concepts through playful, activity-based learning, focusing on shapes, space, and spatial reasoning. It uses hands-on methods (often involving balls and movement) to help students understand geometry in an engaging, practical way, especially in the context of teaching young children. Field: primary, pre-school	Credit: 4 ECTS	Language: English
Summary of the course: This course explores a wide range of short-form children's literature in English (such as tales and stories) and how it can be used to support language development in young learners (ages 3–7). Students learn about different genres and themes, criteria for selecting		



age-appropriate texts, and practical techniques for interactive storytelling and using books effectively in early foreign language education.

Field: primary	Credit: 2 ECTS	Language: English
Summary of the course: The course develops teaching skills for delivering science lessons in English in primary classrooms. It covers topics like Earth science, biology, environment, and health, while focusing on methods such as differentiation, integration, and CLIL (Content and Language Integrated Learning). Students learn to plan and teach lessons that support both subject knowledge and language development in young learners.

<p>Summary of the course: This course develops students' knowledge of classical and contemporary English-language literature from diverse English-speaking cultures, including minority perspectives. Field: primary	Credit: 3 ECTS	Language: English
<p>Summary of the course: The course focuses on developing all four language skills (speaking, reading, writing, and listening) for use in bilingual teaching. It builds the vocabulary and language abilities needed for teaching, improves accuracy and language awareness, and develops presentation skills. Field: pre-school	Credit: 4 ECTS	Language: English
<p>Summary of the course: This course prepares students to teach visual arts (art and craft activities) in bilingual (English-language) preschool settings. It focuses on developing both the methodological skills and the English language foundation needed to plan, organize, and carry out visual education sessions for young children. Field: pre-school	Credit: 4 ECTS	Language: English
<p>Summary of the course: The course focuses on developing future educators' skills for teaching science to young children (kindergarten age) in English. Students build methodological knowledge and practical experience through micro-teaching and reflection, learn about how young children learn about their environment, and explore planning and implementing science activities. Field: pre-school	Credit: 4 ECTS	Language: English
<p>Summary of the course: This course is designed to prepare future pre-school educators to lead music and singing sessions in English. Field: pre-school	Credit: 4 ECTS	Language: English
<p>Summary of the course: This course introduces students to English phonetics and pronunciation, focusing on correct sounds, stress patterns, intonation, and rhythm. Field: early childhood	Credit: 3 ECTS	Language: English
<p>Summary of the course: The course focuses on improving English vocabulary, grammar, and language use in both every day and professional contexts, while also introducing basic concepts of early language acquisition. It familiarizes students with English children's literature and teaches how to use it, along with suitable teaching methods, to support language development in early childhood education. The content develops all four language skills (listening, speaking, reading, writing) through topics related to early childhood care, such as baby care, health, feeding, and nutrition, as well as elements of children's literature like poems, songs, and nursery rhymes.</p> <p>Full course description:</p>

Field: early childhood, pre-school	Credit: 3 ECTS	Language: English
<p>Summary of the course: This course focuses on understanding mental vulnerability—especially in parents—and its effects on families and children. It introduces key concepts of mental disorders, explores how they influence child development, and highlights psychological resilience and ways to strengthen it. Students will learn to challenge stereotypes and develop a supportive, non-judgmental approach when working with vulnerable parents, always prioritizing the child's well-being. The course also builds practical skills such as identifying risk and resilience factors, assessing child safety, and planning supportive interventions in collaboration with professionals.</p>

Summary of the course: It is a practical university course for future early childhood educators. It teaches basic economic concepts, entrepreneurship, and legal knowledge, helping students understand real-life situations, apply them in child-friendly teaching, and navigate the legal aspects of the profession through interactive, practice-based learning.

Field: early childhood, pre-school, primary	Credit: 3 ECTS	Language: English
Summary of the course: The aim of the course is to introduce students to the basic concepts and characteristics of being a national and religious minority, and to provide a basic knowledge of national, ethnic and religious minorities in the world, their historical trials and tribulations and their current situation. The different aspects of intercultural communication and mediation are emphasised in the curriculum, illustrated by historical examples. Special attention is given to the characteristics of national and ethnic minorities in Hungary and Hungarian communities in neighbouring countries, and their current situation in the majority society.

Field: early childhood, pre-school, primary	Credit: 3 ECTS	Language: English
Summary of the course: The course aims to introduce students to the basic technical, tactical, and practical aspects of selected sports, helping them engage in appropriate individual or team physical activities. It also encourages conscious participation in sports by understanding their physiological and psychological effects, and distinguishes between competitive and recreational sports. Additionally, it develops interpersonal skills and highlights how theoretical knowledge can		



improve performance. Students will gain knowledge of the chosen sport's techniques, rules, and tactics, understand the benefits of physical activity, and learn how theory enhances training effectiveness and long-term health. They will develop skills to apply these principles, understand the effects of sport, make informed choices about their participation, and cooperate effectively with others.
